CREATIVE COMMUNITY WORKSHOPS

The Cold Bath Road Mystery is a celebratory arts project, commissioned by North Yorkshire's Chrysalis Arts, for the 100 day cultural festival, when the Tour de France visits Harrogate, and as part of North Yorkshire Open Studios 2014. The event, which takes place over the weekends of Sat 7 and Sun 8 June, Sat 14 and 15 June and Sat 5 and Sun 6 July, will involve a series of performances with puppetry and storytelling, and a visual trail leading up Cold Bath Road to the source of the original cold spring.

Prior to this, Chrysalis is inviting the local community to get involved by helping to create Edwardian-themed street decorations in a series of community workshops. "The story is set in 1907 and we will be making garlands, installations and other decorative items to suit the period," commented Chrysalis Arts' Kate Maddison. "No skills are necessary and the sessions are just as suitable for interested adults and young people who enjoy creative activities as for children and families. The sessions are free and all are welcome to join in but the number of participants per session is limited and advance booking is advisable.

All children must be accompanied by an adult.

Adult volunteers who could assist with making and installing the decorations would also be very welcome.

Chrysalis Arts has collaborated with local businesses and with Harrogate Sustainable Transport in developing the project which, along with North Yorkshire Open Studios, is one of nearly 50 events selected as part of Yorkshire Festival 2014, the first ever cultural festival to precede the Tour de France.
